I'm going to send this catalog out to an expanded list of stores. Some of you may not being doing a vinyl business yet. Here's your hint: it's the one thing that those big sleazeball record chains are absolutely incapable of doing right. Anthemic tunes, wonderfully written and recorded with a BIG, BIG, BIG sound—the kind of album you play and then race for the CD machine to grab yourself another 45 minute adrenaline dose...

Anyone who's paid the slightest attention to my ranting and raving in this catalog and elsewhere knows my feelings

about SoCal sound—that mass produced, cookie-cutter schlock that Epitaph and Fat Wreck shovel out for greenbacks. This ain't it. This is loud, intense, powerchord-heavy punk—ripping, rocking, blazing. One of the five finest albums of this-here year. So belly up to the bar, I'm not joking.

Covina, California's MAD PARADE has been swinging at it since the middle 1980s. This time they've really done it, a 480-foot blast into the third deck in left-center...


THE CONNIE DUNGS split w/TUGBOAT

After a year in Outofprintsville, the debut by Ashland, Kentucky's finest, THE CONNIE DUNGS is back, this time on classic black vinyl with a spiffy new sleeve designed and manufactured by Brandon Dung and The Xerox Corporation. There are a big 150 copies of this gem in the world, band has 50 and I snorked the rest. I'd be delighted to transfer a bunch to your store!

Three chunks of three chord Ramones-influenced punk with unique snotty vocals—"Twenty Years" is a youth anthem of the very highest caliber. Kids are flipping about THE DUNGS, I do a ton of mail order biz on 'em, don't miss this!



THE BOMB BASSETS split w/THE MCRACKENS GP-10 G.I. PRODUCTIONS 7" vinyl format — \$2.25

This is a big, big title and should really haul, both wholesale and retail. THE BOMB BASSETS record for Lookout! and feature pop-punk veterans Dallas and John Dennery along with Dr. Frank of MR. T EXPERIENCE on guitar. Hoo boy. A red hot rave up that includes one newbie and a cover of a BRENT'S T.V. song.

On the flip you get the latest installment from the B.C. Canunks who dress like eggs, THE McRACKINS, who are starting to develop a little following for their infectious RAMONSEY rip.



CHOPPER "For Youth and Valour" OT-46 CRACKLE! RECORDS 7" vinyl IMPORT — \$2.50

Crackle! Records is the UK equivalent of Mutant Pop, co-conspirators in the international conspiracy to bury horrrid corporate alternodreck under a wave of quality poppy punk. This 4th EP by CHOPPER, one of their big guys, is the group's best, most intense, catchy, and original slab of wax. The SoCal poisoning is gone, they're developing their own hot sound!

RR-15 RECESS RECORDS — 7" vinyl format — \$2.25





Anybody that gets essential nutrients from the RAMONES food group will bop their heads and cheer for these guys, fun and catchy with a vocalist with the zaniest accent outside of Italy. Cool guys, too, so you have the proverbial alligning of the planets: cool, ripping, and marketable. SNOTBOY "Coolest Girl in the World" EP VL-21 VML RECORDS — 7" vinyl format — \$2.25

Then there are bands like SNOTBOY that simply *have it*, y'know? You can't put your finger on it, but you know.

Lead singer Johnny Sex is a hepcat that has style and attitude, he sneers with the best of them. Joey Vindictive knows that, he produced this terrific 4 song EP for his VML Records label. Good sense of humor, SNOTBOY'spublishing company is called "Dumb, Pretentious, Pretty Boy Rock Star Songs." Har! Super songs, glossy package, you need this.


While we're on the subject of Ohio bands that rock... My mission statement isn't to flog the maximum amount of crap, it's to turn you on to hot poppy punk bands and help out good poppunk labels. This one qualifies on both counts! THE BARNHILLS feature members of THE KNOW NOTHINGS and some other good band that I forgot (I'm nothing if not honest). Five solid cuts with a touch of JAWBREAKER and SCREECHING WEASEL influence in the guitar work, these guys are definitely a band to watch in the future. Write it down and date it.

THIRSTY split w/I FARM OS-51 CRAP RECORDS — 7" vinyl format — \$2.00



Yep, yep, yep, Liquid Meat recording artists THIRSTY are back with another offering. If TALKING HEAD Soldid an album called *More Songs About Buildings and Food*, THIRSTY should do one called *More Songs About Relationships and Girls*. The Jersey band with the singing drummer do their thing well, four quality tracks, definitely harder than their last offering.

The flip features Ithaca, NY HC sensations I FARM, doing fourthrashers: "Jawbreaker's full of shit and their music's not worth snot... Who's punk? You're not!" Total of 8 tracks!!!

QUINCY PUNX may not be the first choice of the garrulous looking-glass, but they're definitely in the top five, try this on for size: "Boot party on your head/kick and stomp, until your (sic.) dead." Or how about this down-home favorite: "I wish I could leave my dick at home and put on a pair of tits/ Wish I had a nice pink pussy with a throbbing clit." And MRR calls THE AUTOMATICS' lyrics stupid... Sheesh...

If you get past the bonehead lyrics, you'll want to be stocking both of these newly repressed titles, 'cuz QUINCY PUNX are in the inner circle of the supreme pantheon of the crusty drunk punk hall of fame. Their intentionally obnoxious "Fuck P.C." lyrics can be read as an elaborate put-on—as they say "Fuck you if you can't take a joke."

Ho-ho-ho, I still think they're morons. While this definitely ain't my thang, the band has a big following and is definitely a name you should be covering.

THE DIMESTORE HALOES "Hate My Generation" EP

These guys sent me a demo when I was first starting my label and like an idiot I passed... Duh. Glad to find that other people are smarter than I am. THE DIMESTORE HALOES are '77 sound to the max, the poppier variant—somewhat akin to MORAL CRUX or THE SPENT IDOLS. Outstanding songwriters that know how to line up the hooks and deliver them with passion and intensity, which is sort of the deal if punk rock gets you through the day...

These Boston punkers are gonna be around for a long, long time, I know they've got something in the works on Bulge Records. This band merits my heaviest push. Unnnnggggggghhhh! STOCK THIS!!!

THE HUMPERS "Mutate With Me" EP

JR-07 JUNK RECORDS — 7" vinyl format — \$2.35

Another can't-miss-so-don't-pass-it release from Junk Records, THE HUMPERS are super heroes of the *Maximumrocknroll* garage punk crew. I think Epitaph sucked these guys up, I"m sure if that info is wrong I'll get five postcards calling me a braindead drool-sucking retard... Be that as it may, this band rocks, dooode. Sell THE CANDYSNATCHERS to kids who are trying to be trendy and THE HUMPERS to people that have a clue and need to hear a rockin' song or two. This rips and this will sell, a-men.

I'm soooooo proud of myself, halfway down the page and nary a gratuitous "fuck."



VARIOUS ARTISTS "Dumbrock v. 9&10: The Disco Years" 2xEP VM-23 VITAL MUSIC RECORDS — double 7" vinyl — \$3.50



The label has a good line: "with pink and purple vinyl and four different colors of labels, this baby is uglier than a polyester leisure suit." All your disco faves (ha ha) in one package: RATS OF UNUSUAL SIZE doing "Car Wash," SEA MONKEYS raging through "Stayin' Alive," *MRR*'s Mykel Board and ARTLESS mutilating "Macho Man" (yikes!), ALICE DONUT butchering "To Be Real," Wives winging it with "More, More, More," and DOGBOWL cramming a big spoon down America's collective throat with their hideous cover of the most repulsive of all disco songs, "Disco Inferno."

Check this out, but don't forget your vomit bag.

THE MORNING SHAKES split with THE HEARTDROPS

OT-74 MELTED RECORDS — 7" vinyl format — \$2.25

Don't let the small space here lead you astray: this is a great little record. THE HEARTDROPS crank out the hooks with a big, compressed guitar sound, power pop vaguely in the CHEAP TRICK food group replete with rougher, more rockier vocals.

The flipside features celebrations Bobby Sealeand yummy Thunderbird, whose label reminds you to "SERVE COLD." Does anybody actually *serve* Thunderbird? Two great guitar-driven tracks, hot poppy garage rock with a tab o' guitar wank. Hot!



SKIMMER IS BACK!

SKIMMER "Uncool" EP

There's a reason that I've raved about this band in the past—they're totally fucking great! SKIM-MER are the best pop-punk band in England, plain and simple. Their songs buzz and rip right along and they pour a delightful layer of Geddy Lee-esque vocals and harmonies over the top. Yum yum. This is still a band for The Initiated rather than The Novices, not too many yanks have heard of them or heard them. Pity. Totally fab, man.

I first heard this release was on the street when an exporter to Japan sent me a frantic order for tonnage. They know. And you will someday. I sell a bunch to mailorder but you may not be able to sell this band in your shop—unless you push it.

So you decide whether this 4th Crackle! EP is worth your time or not. I know what the answer is in the long run, but for now, you tell me.

This doesn't have anything to do with stuff that I'm selling but I just wanted to tell you that BIKINI KILL "Reject All American" is one of the best punk albums of the year. Please contact the folks at Mordam and act accordingly...

THE CANDY SNATCHERS self-titled CD

Hi-ho, an unsolicited plug for BIKINI KILL and then I move straight to selling THE CANDYSNATCHERS. Yikes! Obnoxious garagey punk rock, with the emphasis on the word obnoxious, their recent *MRR* interview and the propensity of the lead singer twit to roll around in broken glass and slice himself up has definitely made these dolts the front-runners for G.G. ALLIN's mantle. Ho hum. Too fucking expensive, yeah, and the label is out the fucking door as soon as my intials are gone. But you can probably sell lots of these, so grab them while you can.

This rocks sort of like THE ROLLING STONES rock from time to time, y'know? They have their own sound, they aren't trying to copy THE RAMONES or SCREECHING WEASEL or THE QUEERS. Just a great rock and roll band doing their own thing and doing it well.



This is an amazing record, totally early '80s new wavey radio pop. Think NICK LOWE or THE RUBINOOS, THE YACHTS, or something like that. No shit, this is tight enough to be on one of those Rhino Records"Best of American Power Pop" comps. I'm trying to figure out how Brian G.I. hooked up with a band of this magnitude and whether he has the slightest idea of what he has on his hands...

Brian claims this is his top-selling record in Japan. I believe that. Very, very, very good stuff. Will it sell in your shop? Don't know that. I do know that it has four songs, it is of world-class quality, and it includes a cover of "Windy" by THE ASSOCIATION.

TOAST "Come Dancing With..." EP OT-45 CRACKLE! RECORDS — 7" viny! IMPORT — \$2.50

This is not the noisey Japanese TOAST, this is the really good English punk rock TOAST. The second Crackle! EP for this up-and-coming band, four tracks that absolutely, positively will move a pop pit. Excellent pop songwriting combined with a chunka-chunka beat and lead vocals that have a unique flavor with a touch of JELLO BIAFRA. They put some whoa-whoa harmonies over the top and there ya have it—top quality poppy punk rock that is distinctive, catchy, original, and good.

Flip side includes a couple of BAD RELIGION songs, I think: ":Latch Key Kids" and "Best for You."



COME DANCING WITH TOAST

THE WEAKLINGS "Learn How to Dance" EP

THE WEAKLINGS are four guys from Portland, Oregon, they're best known for a split LP that has been widely promoted by some New York label or another. They're a solid enough punk rock band, definitely guitar driven with vaguely garagey vocal delivery. I dunno if that qualifies them as a poppy garage band or whether they're a garagey pop-punk band. These little mysteries make my head spin... They thank THE CANDY SNATCHERS on the sleeve, so I'll opt for the former if push comes to shove.

This decent slab features three cuts, two originals and a cover of "Mystery Dance" by ELVIS COSTELLO.


SERPICO

SERPICO, from New York City, used to be a band called SLEEPER. They made a few records under that moniker, cleaverly trademarked it, then sold the name to some pathetic major label band that also wanted to use it. Tee hee. It was a pretty weak name in any event, SERPICO is much better.

Even though the band is from NYC, best known for its lame metal masquerading as hardcore, this is a solid poppy punk rock release, more akin to the stuff coming from Pennsylvania like WESTON and SLACKER than that bonehead NYC crap.

FIGHTING CAUSE don't play SoCal jock rock, they hammer out a wall of fast-paced sound that will get you bouncing off the walls—definitely a band that The Kids would eat up in a live setting.

Their previous single and split with THE McRACKINS have set the table for the new album. The Kids are starving for politics, look no further than their support of a lame-ass band like PROPAGANDHI if you need evidence. These guys are much better and I expect this album to doreally well. An excellent punk rock band!

F.Y.P Finish Your Popcorn LP RR-04 RECESS RECORDS — LP format — \$4.75



Hmmmmm, F.Y.P.—Finish Your Popcorn... I just wonder... This is the re-release of the 1992 debut album that basically launched Recess Records. F.Y.P is a band known and loved by crusty folk, their new stuff sounds likerough and rugged Screeching Weasel with a snitch of hardcore. I think this is probably a harder record, although I'm not really an LP guy and I didn't get a play copy, so I'm keeping them all nice and pretty to sell you. So I'm guessing...

From California, F.Y.P are a band with a big and growing following and you should definitely get this one covered if you do vinyl biz. One song is called "S.I.B.," I wonder if that's a DEVO cover...

LESS THAN JAKE

"Losing Streak" b/w "The Mixology of Tom Collins" NI-39 NO IDEA RECORDS — 5" vinyl format — \$2.50

LESS THAN JAKE week at Flowerland begins with this can't-miss taste treat, two songs by Florida's biggest, best-known, best-loved, and best-selling ska-punk band on one of those nifty little 5" records that look like they should be coming with a children's toy.

This one is basically a no brainer, I'll use this space for a joke. Lemme go grab *The Oregonian* and see if there's anything good in "The Edge": In Wyoming some guy was defeated in the Democratic primary for U.S. Senate despite his tantalizing proposal to make the space program more efficient by constructing a 22,000-mile-high tower than can ship junk to shuttles in orbit.

LESS THAN JAKE week in the land of 1000 Flowers continues with something you've always needed but never known you had needed because you never knew it existed because you never could have conceived of it existing because the idea is too stupid.

Yes, Florida's biggest, best-known, best-loved, and best-selling ska-punk band does nothing but SLAYER covers here. Nothing like a little death metal to get you going in the morning... I've always suspected that bands that use horns are Satanic... I mean, the devil has horns, right? Too idiotic to be true, if you can't sell this one, paper over your windows and run a G.O.B.

LESS THAN JAKE Losers, Kings, and Things We Don't Understand NI-22 NO IDEA RECORDS — COMPACT DISC format — \$6.75

LESS THAN JAKE week at the Flower farm concludes with a compact disc. Why is this at the bottom of the page in a little tiny space? Ummm, because the label didn't send me enough. They claim the rest of my copies are on back order, I'm waiting. Go ahead and order this, if you're quick you're happy and if you aren't quick it will be out of stock and you'll know the reason why.

THE KINDRED "Treating Me Bad" EP GP-12 G.I. PRODUCTIONS — 7" vinyl format — \$2.25



One of my favorite California bands, their CD is an amazing piece of CLASH-influenced '77 style punk. This second EP marks a return by the band to their previous JAM-influences. There's even a vaguely psychedelic organ on the title cut, a very distinctive sound for a punk record.

Two tracks on the flipside from this San Jose three piece, fairly catchy stuff. Third track, "Wish You Were Dead" is the strongest of the lot, kicking it into third gear and hinting at greatness.


THE STALLIONS Hey Baby, It's... LP JR-00 JUNK RECORDS — LP format — \$5.00

Does the Rip Off Records price hike have you down? I mean: cheesy covers, black vinyl, six bucks?!?! Well, never fear, Junk Records and 1000 Flowers can deliver nice covers, thick slabs of colored vinyl, and beat the price by a buck to boot. So be happy.

THE STALLIONS are from New York City and play rockin' garage punk. The band includes two Japanese women, assuring me of at least one sale to Green Bay, Wisconsin. When you figure out how hard this hits, you'll join the club, too.

Hardcore is about politics, personal and political. Pop-punk is about love and relationships. Garage is about lust and alcohol and THE STAL-

LIONS deliver. Sixteen songs about humping on a chunk of purple wax.



THE LOWDOWNS Diggin' a Hole in the Middle of the World LP JR-04 JUNK RECORDS — LP format — \$5.00



If THE STALLIONS play down and dirty garage, THE LOWDOWNS are more of a straight ahead, hard rocking garage punk band. If you groove on hard driving DEVIL DOGS sort of garage, this hunk of red vinyl will be near and dear to your heart.

Ten songs spinning at 45 rpm, THE LOWDOWNS masterfully blend aggressiveness, roughness, and listenability. This isn't lo-fi dreck, this is intense, full throttle rock and roll with rough edges intact. Almost SEX PISTOLS like here and there... A great day at the office including 9 originals and a cover of "Pill Box" by THE JONESES.




